



DAMAGE ASSESSMENT MISSION TO NECROPOLIS OF MAKLI, THATTA, PAKISTAN CLUSTER 4: MUGHAL MONUMENTS



WHS4-4.01

Date circa Early 17th c. GPS: N 24° 45.159'; E 67° 53.985'; 37m

The octagonal brick tomb of Mirza Jani Baig and Mirza Ghazi Baig is placed on a high plinth. Its unusual cupola carries pierced openings, with extensive use of glazed tile on external and internal faces.

Reconstruction of cupola and new glazed tile work is in evidence. Important to conserve all original features, in particular the stone lattice screens. Brickwork requires stabilization and filling mortar joints to stop further degradation.

No damage due to 2010 rains and influx visible.

MIRZA JANI & MIRZA GHAZI BAIG'S TOMB*

WH54-4.02

Date: circa Early 17th c. GPS: N 24° 45.859'; E 67° 54.221'; 31m

Popularly known as Satcharni, it is a highly complex structure with innovative use of accuate imagery in finely laid burnt brick. The tomb on a stone plinth is believed to be of a Khusrau Khan Charkas, a descendant of Chengiz Khan, who began his service under Isa Khan the Elder.

The dome and upper structure have collapsed. The repairs carried out in the past have not halted its degradation and requires greate efforts for protection.

Damage due to rains and influx cannot be determined.



TOMB OF KHUSRAU KHAN CHARKHAS

The unusual and impressive tomb of Arghun minister Dewan Shurfa Khan (d. 1638) stands on a brick platform, its dome mounted on a drum. Semi-circular stair towers form comers of square footprint. Some of fine glazed lie (&ush) extant.

Over several years restoration was carried out with new kashi work. Severe disintegration and erosion in many parts of brick masonry and kashi.

No damage due to 2010 rains and influx visible.

This monument is the earliest polygon pavilion found at Makli Hill, that is built entirely of dressed stone. This chattri (umbrella) makes its appearance for the first time as a funerary chamber for the celebrated Samma ruler, Jam Tamachi, his queen Nuri and their child. It consists of a 4.87m (16') diameter corbelled dome rising to a height of approximately 4.87m (16') measured internally, and is carried on eight free standing decorative columns capped by bracket capitals.





